



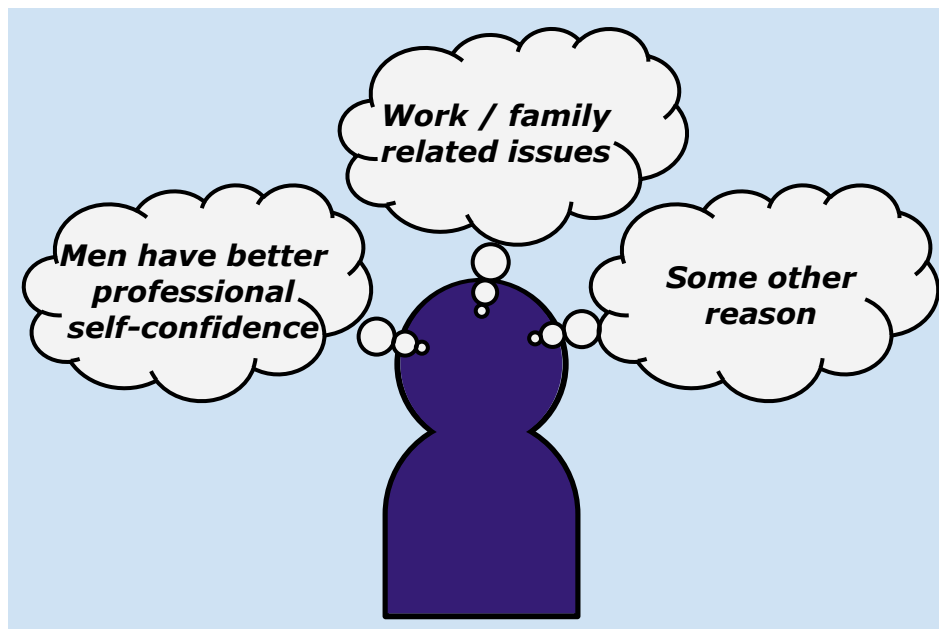
## Everyone Knows Women Are Just as Good as Men, So Why Aren't More of Them in Charge?

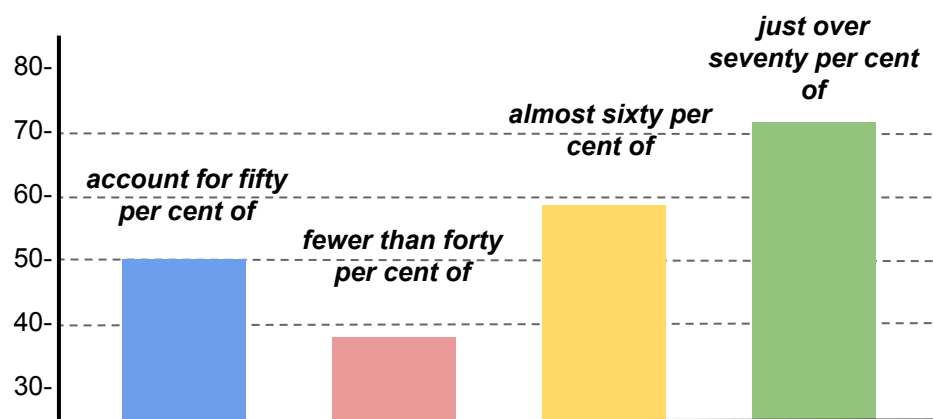
“Women make up almost 60 percent of the labor force but fewer than 4 percent of Fortune 500 chief executives. They do a bit better in the government, where they account for 17 percent of Congress and 12 percent of state governors, but they’re still underrepresented in high-profile fields.

*A meta-analysis of previous studies was carried out by the University of North Carolina to find out if people assume men are better leaders than women. It turns out that no, they don't. Sometimes they even believe the opposite.”*

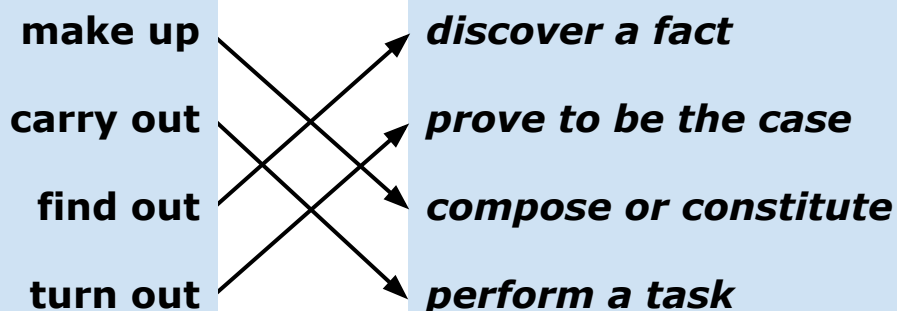
